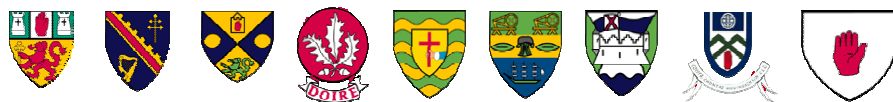


Aim: *To address key issues in the areas of games administration, games development and coaching and refereeing.*
